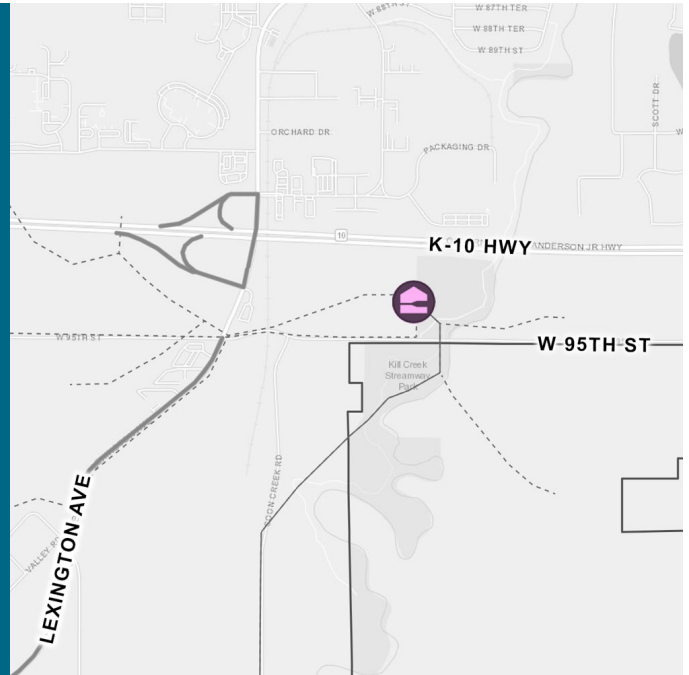


## INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT COMING

### CITY OF DE SOTO, KS ASTRA PUMP STATION

New wastewater pump station  
to service the Astra Enterprise Park and  
surrounding areas.



### WHY?

Most flows to the treatment plant by gravity in pipes. Sometimes the terrain requires sewage to be pumped over a ridge or uphill to the treatment plant.

Benefits of the project include:

- ✓ Meet the growing demand for wastewater system services in De Soto.
- ✓ Provide capacity to meet federal and state regulations.

### WHAT?

Collection system expansion includes construction of a new wastewater pump station at 95<sup>th</sup> Street east of Lexington Avenue.

### WHERE?

The new pump station will be located at the intersection of 95th Street and Lexington Avenue.

### WHEN?

Engineering design was conducted from October 2022 to June 2023. The project construction is expected to start in Fall 2023 and be operational by Spring 2025.

## WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT?

**CONSTRUCTION PHASE:** You can expect heavy equipment and trucks, travel delays, and nuisance dust and noise during construction and installation. Generally, hours of operation for construction are limited to 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. M-F and other times with special permission. Roads may be temporarily closed, and utility services shut off for short periods of time. Delays and changes in travel routes can be expected throughout construction. There may be reduced access to property, sidewalks, and driveways.

### How will I know what is happening, when? And will they need access to my property?

Any access or service interruption to property along the construction route is given in advance. We'll do our best to notify everyone impacted by infrastructure project work, especially if there are closures or disruption in

service. We use door hangers, mail letters, post information on the City's website, and use Notify Jo Co (please sign up for it at left).

### What will be restored following construction?

Trees, walls, sidewalks, fences, grass, plantings, monument signs, etc. will be restored if damaged due to construction activities.

**Pre-Construction/Field Investigations:**

October 2022 to May 2023

**Final Design:** Spring 2023

**Construction:**

Fall 2023 to Spring 2025

**Operations:** Spring 2025
